

Key points of the new regulations covering bicycles and powered and non-powered personal transporters

Regulations covering bicycles and the use of Monabike

- * **Bicycles**
 - Bicycles must be ridden on the road or in cycle lanes.
 - Bicycles may be taken on the pavement provided that they are walked by hand.
 - Children under 12 may not ride on the road unless they are accompanied by an adult; they may ride on the pavement.
 - Under 18s must wear a helmet.
 - Cyclists may ride in bus lanes.
- * **Monabike**
 - The age limit for the use of the Monabike scheme has been reduced from 16 to 14.

Regulations covering powered and non-powered personal transporters

- * **Two types of personal transporter**
 - non-powered: skateboards, roller blades, non-powered scooters.
 - powered: electric scooters, hoverboards, Segways, powered unicycles.
- * **Roller blades, skateboards or scooters (non-powered)**
 - Users are considered to be pedestrians and must therefore travel on pavements.
 - Monaco City Hall may limit the use of such transporters throughout all or part of the country (Municipal Decree No. 2006-024, dated 20 April 2006).
- * **Hoverboards, Segways and powered unicycles**
 - These powered transporters are prohibited from travelling on the road.
 - They may be used in cycle lanes and on cycle paths.
- * **Electric scooters**
 - Electric scooters may be driven on the road, in bus and cycle lanes and on cycle paths.
 - They are not allowed on pavements unless they are being pushed by hand.
 - Users must be at least 12 years old.
 - As with bicycles, under 18s must wear a helmet.
 - Users must wear retro-reflective clothing or devices.
 - Electric scooters must be equipped with brakes, a bell, lights and a reflective device.

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
